- The following is the list of medications to be studied by independent group to assess hazardous risk.
 - Estradiol, medroxyprogesterone acetate, progesterone, testosterone, methimazole, finasteride, fluconazole, oxytocin, tretinoin, clonazepam, colchicine, zonisamide, zidofidine, and sprinolactone, Zonisamide
- Trip would like members of the task force to be part of DOPL's USP800 inspection form creation committee.
- Stepwise approach for implementation of 800---1st step---Hazardous drug designee, list of hazardous drugs for each facility, powder containment hood, certain PPE requirements, and cleaning, disinfecting, and decontamination to be a part of Pharmacy Rules by July 1, 2018 and to be implemented by Dec 1, 2018.
- DOPL has given the board of pharmacy fifty thousand dollars to go towards reviewing list of hazardous drugs. This information will be used by task force to assess risk of hazardous drug and determine level of compounding technique, ppe, and safety measures.
- Chris will speak to Roseman about conducting environmental exposure models to determine efficacy of powder containment hoods, ppe, and external venting.
- Kimberly-Clark N95-46727 air mask was the best air facial mask Trip (University Pharmacy) and Kyle (MedQuest) has tested for N95 USP 800 standards.
- The task force would like to have a task force panel at next UPHA meeting/USHP meetings to help educate pharmacists about USP 800 and other compounding regulations.
- Task force would like to see more outreach through email/fax, UPHA forum, and DOPL website for upcoming 800 requirements as they are set.
- Rob is going to work on Guidance docs for cleaning, disinfecting and decontamination.
