The following actions have been taken by the Division following hearings conducted before an Administrative Law Judge and the respective Licensing Committees or Boards or have been entered by Stipulation or Memorandum of Understanding from April 1, 2008 - June 30, 2008.

PHYSICIANS/SURGEONS

BAILEY, Stanton Anderson, MD

Nephi, Utah

Amended Order:

The probationary condition requiring Respondent to meet with the Physicians Licensing Board was amended to reflect that Respondent is to meet with the Board every six months during the probationary period. This amendment was made retroactive to August 2006 for clarification purposes.
