Respondent's licenses to practice as a physician/surgeon will remain suspended as provided in the September 19, 2007. Respondent agreed not to submit any application for reinstatement of licensure in Utah until September 19, 2009. This Stipulation/Order also outlines what documentation needs to be submitted with an application for reinstatement of his Utah licenses. If a reinstatement application is approved after September 19, 2009, this Stipulation/Order provides for probation with conditions and restrictions.
