APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS AND INFORMATION

General Statement: The Utah Division of Occupational and Professional Licensing (DOPL) desires to provide courteous and timely service to all applicants for licensure. To facilitate the application process, **submit a complete application form including all applicable supporting documents and fees.** Failure to submit a complete application and supply all necessary information will delay processing and may result in denial of licensure. The fees are for processing your application and will not be refunded. **Please read all instructions carefully.**

Address of Record: The address you provide on this application will be your address of record. All correspondence from DOPL will be sent to that address. You are responsible to directly notify DOPL of any change to your address of record. Do not rely on a forwarding order.

Social Security Number: Your social security number is classified as a private record under the Utah Government Records Access and Management Act. It is used by DOPL as an individual identifier. It is also used for child support enforcement pursuant to Subsection 78-32-17(3) and is mandatory pursuant to Subsection 58-1-301(1), Utah Code Ann., which implements 42 U.S.C. 666(a)(13). If an SSN is not provided, the application is incomplete and may be denied.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS AND FEES:

If you are applying for licensure as a professional engineer, complete each of the following in addition to submitting a completed application:

1. Submit official transcript(s) or other appropriate records documenting completion of an approved engineering education program (*See page 3*).
2. Submit a “Verification of Experience” form (*attached to this application*) documenting your qualifying experience.
3. Submit a “Request for Verification of License” form (*attached to this application*) documenting your passing score(s) on the NCEES FE and PE examinations, if you passed the NCEES FE and/or PE examinations in a state other than Utah.

Request that the verifying state(s) complete the form(s) and mail or fax them directly to DOPL or return them to you for submission with your application.

4. Submit the original score report from NCEES Exam Administration Services, formerly Engineering and Land Surveying Examination Services (ELSES), documenting your passing score(s) on the NCEES FE and PE examinations, if you passed the NCEES FE and/or PE examinations in Utah.

5. Submit a completed take-home “Utah Professional Engineer Law and Rules Examination” (*pages 10 and 11 of this application*).
6. Submit a **\$110.00** non-refundable application-processing fee, made payable to “DOPL.”

If you are applying for reinstatement of your professional engineer license, complete each of the following in addition to submitting the information required above:

1. Submit documentation of 24 hours of continuing education completed within the two years immediately prior to submitting your application for reinstatement of licensure.

OR

If you failed to timely complete the required hours of continuing education prior to the expiration of your license, submit documentation of having completed double the number of hours missed. These hours must be completed immediately prior to the submission of this application for reinstatement of licensure.

2. A license expired less than two years: To reinstate a license submit an application for renewal/reinstatement and pay the necessary fees. The required fees include both a renewal fee of \$73 and a reinstatement fee. For licenses expired within 30 days, the reinstatement fee is \$20. The reinstatement fee for licenses expired longer than thirty days but within two years of expiration is \$50. For an example if a license has been expired longer than 30 days but within two years, you would need to submit a reinstatement fee of \$50 along with a renewal fee of \$73 for a total of \$123. *Keep in mind*, these fees are nonrefundable. Check or money orders are to be made payable to DOPL. Do not enclose cash with your application.
3. A license expired longer than two years: This requires a new initial application. The fees for a license expired longer than two years is \$160 (*\$110 for the application fee and a reinstatement fee of \$50*). *Keep in mind*, these fees are nonrefundable. Check or money orders are to be made payable to DOPL. Do not enclose cash with your application.

ADDITIONAL IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

1. **Comity or Interstate Licensing:** Each state has authority or jurisdiction over professional engineers working in that state. The applicant is responsible for knowing the licensing qualifications and laws that apply to the profession for each state in which he/she expects to provide engineering services.
2. **Utah Law and Rules Examination:** Enclosed with this application is the take-home Utah Professional Engineer Law and Rules Examination. Return the completed examination with your application for licensure. Do not submit it separately.

3. **Current Documents:** Applications, statutes, rules, and forms are occasionally changed. Go to www.dopl.utah.gov to ensure you have the most recent version of these documents.
4. **Approved Engineering Education Programs are defined in R156-22-302b, including:**
 - ❑ Engineering education program accredited by EAC/ABET.
 - ❑ Engineering education program accredited by CEAB.
 - ❑ If your MS or PhD engineering education program was not accredited by EAC/ABET OR CEAB, refer to Rule, R156-22-302b(1)(b), to determine if your engineering education program will meet the education requirement for licensure.
 - ❑ A letter from the Utah Department of Transportation certifying completion of the Transportation Engineering Technology and Fundamental Engineering College Program.
 - ❑ If your engineering degree was earned in a foreign country, please see #5 below.
5. **Foreign Educated Engineers:** If your engineering education program was completed in a foreign country, contact NCEES Credentials Evaluations, formerly the Center for Professional Engineering Education Services (CPEES), at www.ncees.org or 1-800-464-7650 to have your foreign engineering education program evaluated to determine equivalency to an EAC/ABET accredited engineering education program.

Request NCEES Credentials Evaluations to submit the original copy of the foreign engineering education evaluation program report to NCEES Exam Administration Services when you apply to take the FE or PE exam.

6. **Verification of Licensure:** You may use either the Utah “Request for Verification of License” form (attached to this application) or you may use the form provided by the state board providing the verification. The verification must include the following information:
 - ❑ Licensure status, including original and expiration date licensure
 - ❑ Passing scores on the NCEES FE and PE examinations
7. **Qualifying Experience:** (*Note the experience must be obtained after the completion of the education requirement.*) You must document 4 years of qualifying experience. In order for your experience to be accepted, it must be verified by one or more licensed professional engineers who supervised your work and at least one additional verification from a licensed professional engineer – other than your supervisor – who has personal knowledge of your knowledge, ability, and competence to practice professional engineering. Request the professional engineer(s) providing verification of your experience to submit the “Verification of Experience” form to you for submission with your license application.

IMPORTANT NOTE: The Verification of Experience form will not be accepted without the stamp/seal of the verifying professional engineer and original signature and date of the verifying professional engineer written across the face of the seal. The form must also be in a sealed envelope with the supervisor’s professional engineer seal stamped across the flap of the envelope.

8. **Requirements to Take the NCEES “FE” Examination:** If you are enrolled in or have graduated from an EAC/ABET engineering education program, apply directly to NCEES Exam Administration Services to register for the FE Examination and pay the examination fee.

Requirements to take the NCEES “PE” Examination: To become licensed in Utah you need four years of qualifying work experience. This work experience must be completed after obtaining an EAC/ABET accredited degree. You are eligible to take the NCEES PE examination after you have completed three out of the four years of qualifying work experience

You need to contact NCEES Exam Administration Services to register for the “FE” and “PE” examination or for registration information contact NCEES Exam Administration Services at www.NCEES.org

Exam Schedules: NCEES examinations are given in April and October of each year. Refer to the NCEES Exam Administration Services website at www.NCEES.org for all examination registration deadlines and examination dates.

NOTE: Persons retaking the exam must contact NCEES Exam Administration Services directly to register for the exam. You DO NOT need to contact DOPL to retake the exam.

9. **Examination Study Guides:** To obtain NCEES examination study guides, contact NCEES at (864) 654-6824, (800) 250-3196, or www.NCEES.org.

10. **Examination Fees:** There are separate fees for all examinations. It is the responsibility of the applicant to submit the fees directly to the testing agency.

11. **NCEES Council Record:** If you are currently licensed, DOPL will accept the NCEES Council Record to document education, passing scores on the NCEES “FE” and “PE” examinations, verification(s) of licensure, and experience.

To obtain an NCEES Council Record, contact NCEES at (864) 654-6824, (800) 250-3196, or www.NCEES.org .

12. **Transcripts:** DOPL will accept official transcripts released to the applicant. Internet transcripts are not accepted. Include the transcripts with the application. Do not send the transcripts under separate cover. Transcripts submitted to NCEES Exam Administration Services for approval to sit for the “PE” exam are forwarded to DOPL after you have passed the examination.

13. **Structural Engineer versus Professional Engineer:** A professional engineer is not permitted to advertise or use the title “Structural Engineer” unless licensed as a structural engineer. There are restrictions as to the size or complexity of a building or structure that a professional engineer designs. Applications for licensure as a structural engineer are available on DOPL’s website at www.dopl.utah.gov .

14. **Seal Design:** The specifications for the seal are found in R156-22-601 of the

Professional Engineers and Professional Land Surveyors Licensing Act Rules.

15. **License Number:** For official records, correspondence, and use of the seal, you may use the first 6 or 7 digits of the license number located on your license.
16. **License Renewal:** All professional engineer licenses expire on March 31 of each odd-numbered year.

Unlike many other states, Utah's license renewal schedule **is not** based on the licensee's date of initial licensure. Under Utah's renewal system, all licenses in each profession expire as a group on the same day every two years. Therefore, the length of a licensee's first renewal cycle depends on how far into the current renewal cycle initial licensure was obtained. Each renewal cycle thereafter is for a full two years.

Additionally, the fee paid with this application for licensure is an application-processing fee only. It does not include a renewal fee. Each licensee is responsible to renew licensure **PRIOR** to the expiration date shown on the current license. Approximately two months prior to the expiration date shown on the license, renewal information is disseminated to each licensee's last address of record, as provided to DOPL.

Please also note that a cashed check does not constitute issuance of a new or renewed license. Fee processing is simply the first step in the evaluation process.

17. **Continuing Education:** Licensed professional engineers are required to complete 24 hours of approved continuing professional education in each two-year period, ending on December 31 of each even-numbered year.
18. **Temporary Licenses:** Not issued.
19. **Updating Address Information:** It is your responsibility to maintain a current address with DOPL. If your address is incorrect, you will not receive renewal notices or other correspondence. Address changes can be made online at www.dopl.utah.gov.
20. **Name Change:** If you have been licensed by DOPL under any other name, please submit documentation of your name change (*i.e. copy of a marriage license or divorce decree*).
21. **Ceremonial Certificate of Licensure:** After obtaining your license from DOPL, you can order a Ceremonial Certificate of Licensure, printed on parchment paper with original signatures and an embossed gold seal. Order forms can be obtained at www.dopl.utah.gov

[58-22-305(1)(c)]
3. _____ When submitting a final set of plans and specifications for a building or structure, the final set of plans normally includes floor plans; elevations; site plans; foundations, structural and framing detail; electrical, mechanical and plumbing design; information required by the energy code; specifications and related calculations as appropriate; and all other documents required to obtain a building permit. [58-22-102(3) and 603(1)]
4. _____ A professional engineer licensed in a state other than Utah is not permitted to engage in professional engineering services in Utah without first being licensed in Utah, unless exempted from licensure. [58-22-501(2) and 58-22-305]
5. _____ A professional engineer licensed in a state other than Utah is permitted to offer to render professional engineering services in Utah without being licensed in Utah to the extent the engineer complies with the requirements set forth in 58-22-305(1)(a).
6. _____ A person preparing a plan and specification for a one or two-family residence not exceeding two stories in height is not required to be a licensed professional engineer. [58-22-305(1)(b)]
7. _____ A licensed professional engineer may affix his/her seal to a plan, specification, and report only when in accordance with 58-22-603.

8. _____ An organization engaged in the practice of professional engineering is exempt from licensure, provided that the organization employs a Utah licensed engineer who is in responsible charge of the professional engineering services provided by that organization, and all other persons employed by the organization, who engage in professional engineering are licensed or exempt from licensure. [58-22-102(7) and 58-22-305(1)(g)]
9. _____ A licensed professional engineer who affixes his/her seal to a plan and a specification in violation of 58-22-603, is subject to administration action up to and including revocation of license. [58-1-501(2) and 58-1-401(2)]
10. _____ Any final plan and specification and report prepared by, or under the supervision of the licensed engineer, shall bear the seal of the engineer, when submitted to a client, when filed with public authorities, or when submitted to a building official for the purpose of obtaining a building permit, even if the practice is exempt from licensure under Section 58-22-305. [58-22-602(2)]
11. _____ A licensed professional engineer may affix his/her seal to a plan, specification, or report prepared by other licensed architects and licensed professional engineers, provided the licensed professional engineer affixing the seal performs a thorough review of all work for compliance with all applicable laws and rules and standards of the profession, and makes any necessary corrections before submitting the final plan, specification or report to a client or to a building official. [58-22-603(1)(c)]
12. _____ A licensed professional engineer may affix his/her seal to a plan, specification or report prepared by persons exempt from licensure as an architect or engineer, provided the licensed professional engineer affixing the seal performs a thorough review of all work for compliance with all applicable laws and rules and standards of the profession, and makes any necessary corrections before submitting the final plan, specification, or report to a client or to a building official.
