MINUTES	Harold Weight made a motion to approve the May 2008 board meeting minutes. Duff Astin seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.
CHAIR ELECTIONS	Duff Astin made a motion to reelect Larry Love as the chair for the Burglar Alarm Board. Scott Sessions seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.
SIEMENS BUILDING TECH QA-Jonathon Carrillo	. Jonathon Carrillo came before the board to request approval as the replacement qualifying agent for Siemens Building Tech. Carrillo had not submitted the test results but stated he had passed the exams and would send those to the board. Astin made a motion to accept Carrillo as the qualifier for Siemens Building Tech Inc contingent on Carrillo submitting the test results. Justin Gray seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

WESTECH INTELLIGENT SURVEILLANCE
QA-Howard J. Stephan

Howard J. Stephan came before the board with the request to become the qualifier for Westec Intelligent Surveillance. The company is already licensed; Stephan would be replacing an existing qualifier. Sessions made a motion to accept Stephan as the qualifier pending fingerprint approval. Astin seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

UTAH CONTROLS
QA-Levi Larson

Levi Larson could not make it before the board. He had applied as a replacement qualifier for Utah Controls. Harold Weight made a motion to approve Larson as the qualifier for Utah Controls subject to the approval of his fingerprints. Astin seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

TOTAL PROTECTION
QA-Corey Green

Corey Green came before the board with the request to become the qualifier for Total Protection. Green met all the qualifications for licensure. Astin made a motion to approve Corey green as the qualifier for Total Protection. Gray seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

HEPWORTH ELECTRIC
QA- J. Parker Hollis

Wyatt Hepworth came before the board requesting licensure as a burglar alarm company. Hepworth Electric is also licensed as a contractor with the same corporation. The reason they were required to appear before the board was to show there would be no conflict of interest between the contractor and burglar alarm side of the company. Where Hollis is a qualifier on another license and did not appear before the board along the company, raised concern with the board. Scott Sessions made a motion to have Hollis appear before the next board. Gray seconded the motion. Weight amended the motion to have a qualifier come before the board at the next meeting. Sessions seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

LOW VOLATAGE

Dan Stewart came before the board to emphasize low voltage electrical installers should be licensed. Meservy stated that this issue had been approached before with the Electrical Board. Industry, however, was not supportive. Stewart was informed he would need to first get support from industry.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

Meservy presented draft changes to the administrative rules.

Changes are as follows R156-55d-102, definitions of individual employed and employee. R156-55d-302c experience requirements, R156-55d-302d examination requirements and R156-55d-603 operating standards – alarm installer. Astin made a motion to accept the proposed changes along with amended changes to the rules discussed in the meeting. Gray seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

TEMPORAY LICENSES

Meservy discussed the elimination of temporary burglar alarm licenses. There was an issue with the statute. Licenses could be issued in the same time frame as a temporary license if the applicant had their fingerprints processed electronically by the Division. There was an ongoing problem with inked fingerprints being rejected. Weight made a motion to discontinue the temporary burglar alarm company agent license immediately. Astin seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.
