MINUTES	Harold Weight made a motion to approve the May 2008 minutes as written. Frank Rydalch seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.
MEMO	Brad Stevens read a memo from F. David Stanley. It was emphasized that when interviewing probationers and applicants, board members need to express feelings, ask

questions and not be afraid to speak up.

ADMINISTRATIVE RULES

Meservy stated that the proposed administrative rules are in review at this time.

It was indicated by the board to have clarification on handyman exemption explained. Meservy explained that there was now a \$3000.00 limit with required liability insurance, electricians, plumbers, HVAC and burglar alarms would have to be licensed in their professions.

CHAIR NOMINATION

Rydalch nominated Brad Stevens to remain as Chair. Weight seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

CONTINING EDUCATION

Jon Jones

Jon Jones was previously approved pending a sample certificate of his program. Jones submitted a sample certificate of program and this was acceptable to the board.

360 Degree Training (Instructor Change)

A request for instructor change from Charles Rogers to Darren K. Elliott was submitted by 360 Degree Training. Included was Elliott's resume. Weight made a motion to approve Darren K. Elliott as the new instructor for 360 Degree Training for NEC 2005 Grounding and Bonding, NFPA 70E and NEC 2005 Wiring and Protection. Rydalch seconded the motion and all members voted in favor. It was indicated by the board that these courses should be updated to the 2008 code.

SCHOOL CURRICULUM OWATC (TRINA HANSEN)

Trina Hansen came before the board to propose a curriculum that Ogden/Weber, Davis, Mountainland and Bridgerland Applied Tech Colleges would adopt beginning this Fall. This new curriculum would be from NCCER. Hansen stated all the UCAT schools would eventually adopt this curriculum. Stevens reminded Hansen that these curricula are approved by the Board and are not up to the schools to decide. There was some confusion from the schools on what level of control the board had as far as the approval of school curricula. It was the opinion of some of the schools that there needed to be more choices. Ford read from the statute where the division does have full authority over the school curriculum. Weight made a motion to decline the NCCER curriculum proposed by Hansen for use by the Applied Tech Colleges. Burton seconded the motion and all members voted in favor. Weight made a motion for Ogden/Weber ATC to bring the NCCER curriculum in its entirety to the board for review. Rydalch seconded the motion and all members voted in favor. It was suggested by the board to have a sub-committee review the information.

SCHOOL COMPETENCY TESTS/PSI TEST RESULTS

Competency test score results were reviewed for Dixie Applied Tech College, Salt Lake Community College along with Ogden/Weber Applied Tech College and Davis Applied Tech College. Tests scores from PSI were also reviewed.

DISCIPLINARY REVIEW

Cameron Craig Chambers

Meservy presented a proposed Memorandum of Understanding for Cameron Craig Chambers who had a criminal record and was currently under probation. Chambers applied to reinstate his apprentice electrician license but would like to turnaround and go for his Journeyman Electrician license. Rydalch made a motion to approve Chambers as long as he has a sponsor for the apprentice electrician license with the condition to have him on probation mirroring the probation he is currently on with the courts. Weight seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

APPLICATION/DISCIPLINARY REVIEW

Out of state applications and applications with special concerns were reviewed.

All business concluded meeting adjourned.
