MINUTES
Harold Weight made a motion to approve the March 2010 board meeting minutes as written. Scott Sessions seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

APPOINTMENTS/APPLICATIONS

Joshua Erickson
Joshua Erickson came before the board requesting licensure as a burglar alarm company agent. The board reviewed with Erickson his criminal history. Sessions made a motion to deny Erickson licensure. Erickson, in an effort to show a longer pattern of clean behavior, needed to wait at least twelve months before reapplying.

Weight seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

B&B Systems, LLC
QA: Justin Burnett

The board reviewed the application for B&B Systems with Justin Burnett as the qualifier. Justin Gray made a motion to approve B&B Systems as a burglar alarm company with Burnett as the qualifying agent. Sessions seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

Safe Haven Security Services, Inc.
QA: Christopher Dobson

Christopher Dobson appeared before the board. Dobson was to be the qualifying agent for Safe Haven Security Services. Sessions, after the board reviewed the matter, made a motion to approve Safe Haven Security Services as a burglar alarm company with Dobson as the qualifier. Weight seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

Safe and Sound Systems, Inc.
QA: James Folker

James Folker appeared before the board. Safe and Sound Systems had made application for Folker to be their replacement qualifier. Sessions made a motion to approve Folker as the new qualifier for Safe and Sound Systems. Gray seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

TEMPORARY LICENSES

The temporary licenses, as recently passed by the state legislature, are to be requested by a burglar alarm company and are restricted to the company's office and/or call center personnel. The board suggested individuals cited with this type of license for doing door-to-door sales appear before the board along with the burglar alarm company that hired them. According to Wayne Holman, due process would have to occur first. Mark Steinagel stated the Division would be very strict with the temporary license. Staff would cancel the temporary license if the applicant changed companies.

Carolyn Dennis, supervisor of the Division's criminal history unit, came before the board. She explained the temporary license has the name of the company that the individual works for and the license indicates that is valid only for the office or call center.

Dennis said problems associated with the temporary license included unreadable fingerprints, improper identification, and outdated applications. She had been working with the companies involved to resolve these issues.
