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Overview

In 2014, 32% of Utah adults aged 18 years and older had been prescribed an opioid pain medication in the previous 12 months. Eight Utah adults die each week from an opioid overdose, of which, four deaths are due specifically to prescription opioids. And 80% of heroin users started with prescription opioids. We all need to continue to work together to find solutions to safely address pain management and prevent prescription opioid overdoses.

Purpose

The goal is to provide recommendations to prescribers regarding best practices in the prescribing of opioids. The recommendations are in accordance with:

- the 2022 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain;
- the *Utah Clinical Guidelines on Prescribing Opioids for Treatment of Pain*, published by the Utah Department of Health and Human Services with support from the Utah Medical Association

Law



[UCA§58-37f]

Utah Controlled Substance Database Act

Originally enacted in 1995, this law has been updated to reflect the Controlled Substance Database (CSD) utilization expectations and prescriber education.

Law

[UCA § 58-37f-304 section 2]

Checking the Database:

- A prescriber shall check the database for information about a patient before the first time the prescriber gives a prescription to a patient for a Schedule II or III opioid.
- If a prescriber is repeatedly prescribing a Schedule II opioid or Schedule III opioid to a patient, the prescriber shall periodically review information about the patient.
 - Originated as House Bill 127 from the 2018 general session

[UCA § 58-37-6-11 (a-d)]

<u>High Risk Prescriptions with Multiple</u> Practitioners:

- A practitioner who issues a high risk prescription to a patient shall, before issuing the high risk prescription to the
 patient, verify in the database that the patient does not have a high risk prescription from a different practitioner that is
 currently active.
 - "High risk prescription" means a prescription for an opiate or a benzodiazepine that is written to continue for longer than 30 consecutive days.
- If the database shows that the patient has received a high risk prescription that is currently active from a different practitioner, the practitioner may not issue a high risk prescription to the patient unless the practitioner:
 - o contacts and consults with each practitioner who issued a high risk prescription that is currently active to the patient;
 - documents in the patient's medical record that the practitioner made contact with each practitioner
 - documents in the patient's medical record the reason why the practitioner believes that the patient needs multiple high risk prescriptions from different practitioners

[UCA§58-37f-301(5)]

Third Party Notifications:

- A individual may request that the division provide the information to a third party who is designated by the individual each time a controlled substance prescription for the individual is dispensed.
- An individual who has made a request for a third party, may also direct that the division to discontinue providing
 information to the third party upon written notice.

[UCA§58-37-6.5]

Continuing Education for Controlled Substance Prescribers

A controlled substance prescriber shall complete at least 3.5 hours of continuing education in one or more controlled substance prescribing classes, except dentists who shall complete at least two hours.

[UCA§58-37-6.5]

Limitations on Day's Supply

- A prescription for a Schedule II substance may not be refilled.
- A Schedule II controlled substance may not be filled in a quantity to exceed a one-month's supply, as directed
 on the daily dosage rate of the prescriptions.
- A prescription for a Schedule II or Schedule III controlled substance that is an opiate and that is issued for an
 acute condition shall be completely or partially filled in a quantity not to exceed a seven-day supply as
 directed on the daily dosage rate of the prescription.
