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Utah Invisible Condition Alert Program S.B 148

Utah's <u>Invisible Conditions Alert Program</u> is a voluntary program that allows a person with a <u>qualifying</u> physical or mental condition to have a decal placed on a driver's license or ID card.

Utah's Invisible Condition Alert Program is designed to promptly notify first responders about a person's invisible condition that may directly impact the person's ability to communicate. Early identification of an invisible condition during interactions allows first responders such as law enforcement, firefighters, or emergency medical personnel to approach situations with heightened awareness and respond appropriately.

- 1. As a Health Care Professional practicing in Utah, it's necessary for you to provide informational resources about this initiative to your patients in accordance with Utah's Code <u>58-1-603</u>. Additionally, you will be required to verify the presence of an invisible condition.

This program allows for an invisible condition identification symbol to be applied to a driver license or identification card.

Invisible condition means a physical or mental condition that may interfere with the ability to communicate with a law enforcement officer. For example:

Communication impediment
Hearing loss
Autism spectrum disorder
Drug allergy
Alzheimer's disease or dementia
Post-traumatic stress disorder
Traumatic brain injury
Schizophrenia
Epilepsy
Developmental disability
Down syndrome
Diabetes
Heart condition
Other condition identified by a health care

professional
